PIO,

Here's the current update on the fire situation:

- **Dry Cleaners:** Fire is fully contained; no further spread.
- Subway Sandwich Shop: Fire has been suppressed; minor damage sustained.
- Sherwin Williams/Meth Lab: The initial explosion was contained at the meth lab front; however,
 the fire is now spreading into two adjacent commercial buildings due to a high fuel load
 (including paper products and stored chemicals). We have deployed additional engines, aerial
 water drop units, and rescue teams to manage this. Regional support for increased water supply
 and manpower has been requested.

We will continue to monitor and update you as the situation evolves.

Our current status for aerial operations is as follows:

- **FD Truck 1:** Currently conducting water drops over the Sherwin Williams area; drops occur every 5–7 minutes.
- FD Truck 2: En route to provide additional support; expected to be operational within 5 minutes.
- Preliminary assessments indicate that the aerial drops are slowing the fire's progression, but the sheer volume of combustible materials in adjacent buildings is a significant challenge.

We will update you with any changes.
