

You are tasked with preparing a press conference to address a critical public safety incident. Use the provided materials to analyze the situation and craft a clear, accurate statement.



Hi Jordan,

Here's what we handled:

- **Patients Evaluated:** Three total.
 - 1 adult male with burns and trauma injuries from the explosion, transported to Memorial General.
 - 1 child with minor injuries and smoke inhalation, treated on scene.
 - 1 adult female deceased on arrival—smoke inhalation.
- We initially thought we had four patients, but it turned out one was just a bystander overcome by anxiety.
- **Easy access:** We had clear visibility on the stairs leading to the third floor.

Traffic was a bit of a headache near Windcrest Blvd., but we managed to get out quickly with the patient transport. Let me know if you need anything else.

Hi Jordan,

Here's what we have so far from our preliminary analysis:

- **Device Composition:** The explosive device was homemade, utilizing chemical accelerants and common metallic shrapnel components like nails and screws to maximize harm.
- **Detonation Method:** Evidence suggests the device was remotely triggered using a cell phone mechanism.
- **Blast Radius:** The explosion's effective radius was approximately 30 feet, causing significant damage to Units 205-213.
- **Notable Investigation Notes:** Initial findings indicate a high degree of planning. The materials used were easily accessible, and the placement in Unit 205 suggests an intent to target densely occupied areas. Further analysis is underway to confirm the origin of the materials and potential suspects involved.


Subject: Fwd: ATF Input on Press Release
